Concert violinist and teacher Adam Nelson started violin at the age of

five in the small town of Port Elgin where he grew up. After finishing his undergraduate degree at Wilfrid Laurier University, and his master's in Violin Performance at the University of Ottawa, he settled with his wife in the Barrhaven area. Aside from performing with major ensembles such as the National Arts Centre Orchestra, Nelson runs a large private violin studio, with many of his students winning top honours at major Canadian music festivals.



A musician with an array of artistic talents, **Roland Graham** is an accomplished keyboardist, conductor, composer, teacher and impresario. He is the founding Artistic Director of the Doors Open for Music at Southmin-



ster concert series. He has been heard as a pianist on CBC Radio 2 and had compositions performed in Canada and abroad, notably his Canticles for the Evening Service, which were premiered at Canterbury Cathedral in the UK. He holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Ottawa and a master's from the Université de Montréal, where he studied memory and performance techniques in the keyboard music of J.S. Bach.
