He is the past music director of Strings of St. John's and the Ottawa Chamber Orchestra and most recently has conducted both Ottawa Junior and OYO. Since 'switching' to viola, David has enjoyed be-

ing a regularly invited extra with the Berlin Philharmonic.

Caroline Léonardelli is a renowned soloist, chamber musician, and teacher. Caroline's solo recording El Dorado received a JUNO Award nomination. Her second. Impressions de France, has been selected by Apple Music editors for their worldwide harp feature. Caroline has been described as a "World Class Harpist" in Harp Column Magazine and her latest recording, Senenata, was reviewed by Remy Franck where he noted, "Serenata is one of the most beautiful harp CDs I have ever heard, and it will melt every heart."
