Caelis Academy Ensemble was formed in 2017 by Matthew Larkin and a number of colleagues who sought to form a chamber-sized singing group devoted to the cathedral and oratorio traditions of musical performance. Caelis actively promotes three complementary values rooted in excellence: workmanship, learning, and community.

Since then, the choir has grown to a membership of forty singers, who are themselves based locally, in Montreal, and in Toronto, which gives the ensemble a broad identity. They have performed well over a hundred concerts (with many more in recordings and streams), which have included some of the most significant works in the canon of oratorio and liturgical music. The choir has been invited to serve as musicians-in-residence at St. Paul's Cathedral (London, UK) this forthcoming summer.
